

Experience Sharing Workshop at Shree Janahit Secondary School, Dapcha on 12 December 2022

On 12 December 2022, Rupantaran-KU organized an Experience Sharing Workshop at Shree Janahit Secondary School, Dapcha. Teachers from the school shared their experiences on how the school has changed in a positive way and the challenges during this period.

The first session was provided by Mr. Ram Chandra Shrestha about the effectiveness and the outcome of the school results after the project. He has described the improvement of school gardening, kiwi and mushroom farming, Eco-San, and the student's enrollment in practicals which has been reflected in their classroom activities and daily life. Also presented how students are involved in school gardening, mushroom farming, and maker space.

Mr. Sudip Raj Kharel, an economics teacher at Janahit School described the use of STEAM Education at school and explored the floor for the debate about the use of STEAM, Research Study, and School Improvement after the entry of the project. He presented very well on the subject that why students are enrolled less in community schools and gave the justification for the same topic (20% of students are still not getting proper food, due to poor family backgrounds). He properly presented the student's needs and gave an example of one cannot get proper attention in the classroom while he/she is hungry, and we should look after those poor background students for a quality outcome.

The session was fruitful and teachers from the school were enjoying listening to the experience of their colleagues. Mr. Madhav Adhikari explained professional growth as well as personal development. He explained that the educational resources that have been provided to school were effective which has made their teaching easier than past. The use of ICT and portfolio management in school helped them to develop and plan the questionnaire and helped to share lessons through power points. Due to such activities in school, teachers are witnessing an increase in the pass rate of students. He personally thanked KU-Rupantaran Team for the teacher training and improvement in teaching learning in school.

Mr. Min Bahadur Lama shared his experiences with knowledge transformation and training regarding transformation and rubrics. He learned the main aspects of waste management from those sessions and developed a plan for how the school will be after 10 years from now. He also presented the lessons learned from the exchange visit to Shree Jana Jiwan Secondary School, Chitwan which has uplifted the classroom activities in school.

At the end of the workshop, the teachers from ECD shared their experiences in these few years. They have presented how the school developed after the project. They have improved in teaching by using ICT in the classroom, Visual explanations to children. Also explained how teachers are getting benefits from school gardening.
